



ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS



During the 2023-24 school year, Candor Health Education delivered 3,051 health education programs serving 660 schools across 11 Illinois counties in Indiana, New York, and Wisconsin. Our 18 professional health educators taught essential health topics to 81,856 students.

81,856
students served

Candor works in elementary and middle schools across suburban Cook, DuPage, Will, Kane and Kendall counties. During FY24, **we partnered with 53 new schools** and **returned to 18 schools that stopped using Candor during COVID.**

Last year 143 existing school partners added over 400 new programs. The additional classes provided 13,000 students additional, valuable health information such as healthy relationship or how to avoid peer pressure to vape or drink alcohol.

SPANISH TRANSLATION

More schools are requesting Spanish language programs and parent materials. In FY24 we translated Parent & student materials components of our two most popular programs (Puberty I and Human Reproduction & Embryology).

13,440

spanish speaking students received programs with spanish translation

12,000

students received free or discounted programs

This accounts for 16% of the total students educated. Approximately half of all discounted programs were sex education programs that targeted lower resourced communities. In FY24, ***we raised enough funding to deliver 202 free or discounted sex education programs benefitting 6,616 young people at 48 priority schools.*** 80% of those students were low income and they were supported through our Health Education for All (HEFA) Fund which gives a sliding scale fee to schools serving at least 40% low-income students.




